Orientation and TBRI Caregiver Training

January 26th, we held an Orientation for people interested in foster care, adoption, and wraparound family services. 45 people attended and heard presentations from Amaris Ministries, CASA, Charlee Homes, and the Imperial County Department of Children and Family Services.

The following week we started a 12-week course of TBRI classes facilitated by Annette Rea. TBRI stands for Trust-Based Relational Intervention and is an absolute

The Reas shared part of their personal story about having 3 biological children, then adopting a sibling set of 4 sisters through foster care, then later adopting a baby through foster care, and now going through the process of adopting 3 of their young grandchildren. Their oldest adopted daughter Carrie shared her perspective through a video testimony about what it was like to end up in foster care and then be adopted by a family who was willing to keep the siblings together. This family has been through a lot, but they have an amazing and inspiring story. MUST when it comes to parenting or working with "kids from hard places." It works really well on biological kids and spouses too ;-). We are particularly excited because 4 people on staff at New Creations are going through the classes with the goal of getting certified to be able to facilitate them later for people in New Creations and others who are court-ordered to attend parenting classes or trying to reunify with their children. In addition to teaching these classes, these skills are excellent for the staff to learn because they gain an understanding of how trauma impacts the brain and behavior, and pretty much everyone in programs like New Creations of been through some kind of trauma. Trust-based, connecting methods are much more affective at bringing about healing and building relationships than punitive, non-connecting methods. These 4 staff are a wonderful addition to our class of about 20 people that meets every Thursday evening in the Christ Community Church Fellowship Hall.

April 7-8, 2017 @ 9:00 am – Empowered to Connect Simulcast at Calvary Chapel in El Centro. This is an outstanding conference put on by Show Hope (the adoption ministry founded by Stephen Curtis Chapman and his wife) that is great for anyone who works with children and especially for foster and adoptive parents. We host the simulcast to make it more accessible for Imperial valley parents to attend. \$25/person includes light breakfast / lunch besides workbook. *CEU's available for professionals.
