CARING FOR CHILDREN IN NEED...

There is a great need for foster parents – not just any foster parents – families willing to open both their hearts and their homes to children who have experienced the trauma of abuse, neglect, and loss. These families need to undergo trauma-competent care training and learn skills such as TBRI (Trust-Based Relational Intervention) in order to gain an understanding of how trauma impacts the brain and acquire the tools necessary to bring hope and healing to these precious children who have been through so much. There is an especially great need for families to take in hard-to-place children such as those with special needs, older children and teens, aged out young adults, and sibling sets.

Foster Care Statistics:

- Over 400,000 kids in foster care in the US
- Over 107,000 of these kids are adoptable and waiting for forever families
- Over 20,000 age out of the system each year with no family or support
- About 62,000 kids in foster care in California
- About 420 kids in foster care in Imperial County

Being a foster parent and working with "the system" is rarely easy. It is a battle in so many ways. There is a need for families who are willing to see the potential in these children, see that they are made in God's image and that He has a plan for them, willing to fight for these children by going through the steps it takes to be there for them in ways that they need, and willing to risk broken hearts for the purpose of being used to bring healing to the hearts of these children.
